EB MAGDALENE TRABUE, b. 1748, Chesterfield Co., Va.; d. 1818, Person Co., N.C.; m. Edward Clay, ca 1770, Chesterfield Co., Va.; b. 1748, Chesterfield Co., Va.; d. ca 1820, Person Co., N.C.

Edward Clay was a son of John Clay (1718-1761) and Mary Baskerville Bass, a sister of Magdaline Baskerville Trabue, second wife of (AB) John Trabue. Edward Clay's brother was Rev. John Clay, the father of Senator Henry Clay, the distinguished orator and statesman. John Clay, the father of Edward, was a brother of Charles Clay, the grandfather of Jane Clay, who was the second wife of (EI) Edward Trabue.

In his father's will, written Nov. 15, 1761, Edward Clay was left 270 acres of land on Dumplin Branch in Chesterfield Co., Va. which he sold to Gideon Flournoy in 1770 (Chesterfield Co. Deed Book 6, p. 114). On March 21 of that year, he bought 944 acres of land in Charlotte Co., Va. (Charlotte Co. Deed Book 2, p. 338) and on Nov. 2, 1770, Edward sold the plantation of John Clay in Chesterfield Co. which had been inherited by Mary Bass Clay (Chesterfield Co. Deed Book 6, p. 260). In 1777, his remaining property in Charlotte Co. became a part of Lunenburg Co. He had sold 270 acres in 1776, and he sold the remaining 674 acres on March 2, 1778 to Matthew Robertson (Lunenburg Co. Deed Book 13, p. 111).

A deed entered on Nov. 4, 1778, records Edward's purchase of 440 acres of land in Caswell Co., N.C. (Caswell Co. Deed Book A, p. 203) and on Oct. 10, 1783 he purchased an additional 300 acres (Caswell Co. Deed Book B, p. 121). He is listed in the 1790 Heads of Families in Caswell Co., N.C. and in that year his lands became part of Person Co. The area where Edward and his descendants lived centered around the town of Milton in Caswell Co., including portions of Person Co., N.C. and Halifax Co., Va. Edward continued to buy land until 1819 and he gave land to his son, Edward Jr., in 1801 (Person Co. Deed Book C, p. 323), and sold land to his son, James Clay, in 1818 (Person Co. Deed Book E, p. 105).

On June 3, 1795, Edward Clay gave slaves to his grand-children: Nancy Rogers, Magdalene Rogers, Rachel Rogers, and Giles Rogers, children of Byrd and Sarah Rogers (Person Co. Deed Book B, p. 102). After the death of Magdalene Trabue Clay, Edward made another deed of gift in order to settle a controversy among his children regarding the slaves who had come to Magdalene from her father, John James Trabue. This deed of gift was dated Sept. 18, 1819, and recorded in Person Co. Deed Book E, p. 193. It is particularly helpful in establishing names and marriages of the children and spouses of Edward and Magdalene Clay. It lists: Edward Clay, Jr.; John Richmond and his wife, Judith; John Montgomery and Martha, his wife; Sarah Rogers; Mary Gold; Jeremiah Fletcher and Frances, his wife; and James Clay.

Edward Clay owned a considerable number of slaves and was a large land owner. From the following quote it appears that

- EBA SARAH CLAY, b. ca 1770/1774; m. Byrd Rogers, Feb. 4, 1785, Caswell Co., N.C., Edward Clay, Sr., bondsman; b. ca 1770/1774. He is listed in the 1800 Caswell Co., N.C. census. He is not mentioned in Edward Clay's deed of gift, but Sarah Rogers is named. He is probably a son of John Rogers & Mary Byrd. John Rogers' parents were Giles Rogers & Rachel Eastman, & two of the grandchildren of Byrd & Sarah Clay Rogers were named Rachel E. Rogers & Giles Rogers. We have read that descendants of this family moved to Alabama, but we have not traced them further. On June 3, 1795, Edward Clay made a deed of gift to their four children.
- EBB JOHN CLAY, d. before 1819. He is not mentioned in Edward Clay's deed of gift.
- EBC SAMUEL CLAY, d. before 1819. He is not mentioned in Edward Clay's deed of gift.
- EBD MARY CLAY, m. (1) John Dameron, Jan. 18, 1800, Caswell Co., N.C., Edward Clay, Jr., bondsman. (2) William Gold, July 30, 1806, Caswell Co., N.C. He is not mentioned in Edward Clay's deed of gift in 1819, but Mary Gold is named.
- EBE PHOEBE CLAY, d. before 1819; m. Loftin Walton, Nov. 11, 1801, Person Co., N.C., Reubin Walton, bondsman. They are not mentioned in Edward Clay's deed of gift in 1819. From N.C. marriage records: Loftin Walton m. Nan Black, Jan. 2, 1806, Person Co., N.C.
- EBF EDWARD CLAY, JR., b. ca 1780; m. Polly Watkins, Dec. 11, 1803, Halifax Co., Va. She was a daughter of CBA Magdalene Dupuy & Thomas Watkins, of Halifax Co., Va. Edward Clay, Jr. is named in Edward Clay's deed of gift in 1819. On Aug. 11, 1801, he was given "the present home of Edward Clay, Sr." by his father, Edward Clay, Sr. (Deed Book C, p. 323). They moved to Tn. and settled in Wilson Co., where he is listed in the 1830 Tn. census.
- EBG JUDITH CLAY, m. John Richmond, Dec. 20, 1802, Person Co., N.C., Edward Clay, Sr., bondsman. He is listed in the 1800, 1810, 1820, 1830 & 1840 N.C. censuses in Caswell Co. Both are listed in Edward Clay's deed of gift in 1819.
- EBH FRANCES CLAY, m. Jeremiah W. Fletcher, Feb. 15, 1803, Person Co., N.C., Edward Clay, Sr., bondsman. He is listed in the 1810 census in Caswell Co., N.C. Both are named in Edward Clay's deed of gift in 1819.
- EBI MARTHA CLAY, m. John Montgomery, Feb. 3, 1810, Person Co., N.C., James Clay, bondsman; b. ca 1774/1784. He is listed in the 1820 & 1830 Caswell Co., N.C. censuses. Both are named in Edward Clay's deed of gift in 1819.
- EBJ JAMES CLAY, b. ca 1789, Caswell Co., N.C.; d. Jan. 16, 1847, Cole Co., Mo.; m. (1) Lucy Rogers, Dec. 19, 1810, Person Co., N.C., John Montgomery, bondsman. (2) Phoebe Johnston, Oct. 22, 1819, Caswell Co., N.C.; b. 1790, Caswell Co., N.C.; d. June 4, 1866, Cole Co., Mo. She was a daughter of Samuel Johnston & Elizabeth Ballinger. He bought 400 acres of land from his father in Person Co., N.C. on March 3, 1818 for 500 pounds, & is named in Edward's deed of gift in 1819. They moved to Mo. in 1840 & Phoebe Clay is listed in the 1850 & 1860 Mo. censuses.
